Financial information is monthly and in a very basic format. Detailed information can be obtained by contacting either Linda Niles or the Ministries Council Member. A list of each ministry and the contact person is displayed in the copy room above the mail bins.

Utility expense is over budget due to the furnace issue. Over time this will come back into line; Property maintenance is under budget primarily due to building maintenance and property taxes; Even though lawn/yard/parking lot is under budget primarily due to time of year, it is an area where we can save money with volunteer help; Administrative expenses under budget because December payroll booked in December rather than January (normal procedure); Outreach under budget due to timing of distribution; Meeting/Clergy Mileage under budget because Convention will be in October as a one time expense but mileage reimbursement is over budget.

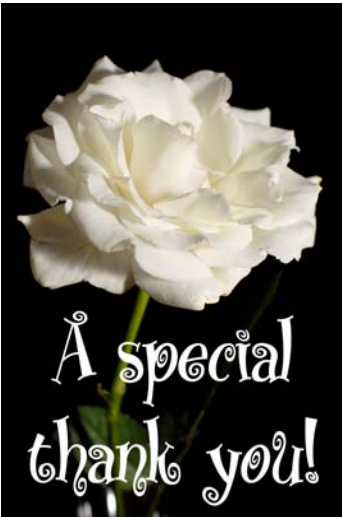

Church words & what they mean

Confirmation: The sacramental rite in which the candidates “express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop”. Confirmation has been increasingly understood in terms of a mature, public reaffirmation of the Christian faith and the baptismal promises.

Pentecost: The term means “the fiftieth day”. It is used in both the Old and the New Testament. In the Old Testament it refers to a feast of seven weeks known as the Feast of Weeks. It was apparently an agricultural event that focused on the harvesting of first fruits. In the New Testament it refers to the coming of the Spirit on the day of Pentecost, shortly after Jesus’ death, resurrection and ascension. In the Christian tradition, Pentecost is now the seventh Sunday after Easter. It emphasizes that the church is understood as the body of Christ which is drawn together and given life by the Holy Spirit.

Don Green as Guest Speaker



Being one of the very few remaining survivors of the Pearl Harbor attack, our own Don Green has become a popular and often called upon speaker about his experiences during that time.

One of the first times he was invited to speak was during the time the movie "Tora! Tora! Tora!" was being shown at the Callow Avenue Theatre in Bremerton. He spoke prior to the film being shown, and for several days during the run. An article was published in the Kitsap Sun advertising his speech. Don remembers several young people from the audience coming up to him after, asking for his autograph on their copy of the newspaper article. What great audiences!

After that, Don spoke at the Bremerton Lions' Club to a group of about 75 adults. Then a gentleman he met at a Remembrance Ceremony in Port Orchard



arranged for him to speak about his Pearl Harbor experiences at a special dinner held for more than 90 PSNS supervisors from Shop 38. Following his speech, the DVD he had given his host was shown to all attending. In appreciation for his fine speech and service during WWII he was presented with a framed aerial view of the Bremerton-Silverdale area which included the Puget Sound Naval Shipyard. This picture was signed by the commander of the PSNS Shipyard.

During the weekend of March 13-15 of this year, Don was invited to speak before two different groups in Denver, CO. The invitation included an all expenses paid round trip for both Don and his daughter, who accompanied him. The first audience was the Sons of the American Revolution, and the second was the Mountain Chapter of Pearl Harbor Survivors.

Soon after returning from his trip to Denver, Don was invited to speak to the students of Capital High School in Olympia. Following, he spoke to a Kiwanis Group in Bremerton. Word seems to be spreading.....!

In addition to his faithful service to St. Hugh Church, our Don Green is keeping quite busy with telling the chilling story of how life was for him and other servicemen during a terrible time in the history of our country. May God continue to bless him, as he brings history alive as only he can! Many thanks to you, Don.
